## teamsters for aa maintenance

- Why now?
   The mechanics at American Airlines no longer want the TWU as their union. The Teamsters are the best maintenance and related representative in the airline industry.
- What is the Teamsters Airline Division?
   We are a division of the International Brother-hood of Teamsters that is dedicated to representing airline and aviation workers.
- How many aviation mechanics and related workers do the Teamsters represent?
   Of the 80,000 members represented by the Airline Division, 18,000 are mechanics and related workers.
- At what airlines do the Teamsters represent mechanics and related workers?
   UAL, CAL, CMI, UPS, XJT, ASA, Frontier,
   Piedmont, Horizon and NetJets.
- Will the Teamsters organize AA Fleet
   Service (Ramp) and Stores workers?
   No, the Teamsters are only looking to organize mechanics and related classes and crafts.
- Are Teamster International Executive
   Board officials elected or appointed?
   The Teamsters General Executive Board is voted
   on by the membership every five years. This is
   not a delegate election. One member, one vote!

- Are the Teamsters affiliated with the AFL-CIO?
   No.
- Will my contract be negotiated by truck drivers?
   No! The Teamsters Airline Division has skilled airline negotiators and dedicated attorneys that specialize in RLA bargaining.
- Can the contract be reopened once the Teamsters are certified as our new union?
   Yes. The newly-certified union can file Section 6 to reopen the contract.
- Can I sign more than one authorization card?
   Yes! But if you do not want AMFA on the ballot, you should stop signing their cards now.
- What will be different under Teamster representation?

No matter what contract you are under, the Teamsters will represent you with power and resources. Once certified, the Teamsters Airline Division will represent over 30,000 AMT and related workers at the two largest carriers in the nation. With that strength in numbers, we can then begin to rebuild our profession and regain the status we once enjoyed in the airline industry.
