



WHOLE PRISON LABOR

Although Whole Foods caters to the “socially conscious” consumer, it relies on the labor of predominantly black prisoners to make a profit.

Whole Foods purchases tilapia raised by prisoners in Colorado and Missouri in addition to cheese made from goats milk also raised and milked by prisoners.

These prisoners earn as little as 74 cents per day while Whole Foods sells the cheese and fish for much more to consumers. Tilapia sells for as much as \$11.99 per pound.

The U.S. has the highest prison population in the world, and those largely affected by the Prison Industrial Complex are people of color, especially blacks.

It is unconscionable that Whole Foods is earning a profit off the backs of incarcerated black people.

With the way Whole Foods has been acting, it is no surprise The International Labor Rights Forum found that Whole Foods’ primary supplier, UNFI, issued death threats to minority workers in Moreno Valley, Calif.
