STRIKE FAQs

Q. ARE WORK-FROM-HOME NURSES PERMITTED TO STRIKE AND PICKET?

A. Yes.

Q. DURING WHAT HOURS WOULD A STRIKE OPERATE?

A. Both striking and picketing would be 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Q. CAN I PICKET AT ANY COREWELL HEALTH EAST CAMPUS?

A. No. You will be required to picket at your campus, unless otherwise instructed by the union. In the event of a strike, further details will be provided for remote workers and those working in clinics and at ambulatory sites.

Q. WOULD WE BE ABLE TO GET UNEMPLOYMENT IF A STRIKE OCCURS?

A. Under Michigan law, unemployment benefits are not available to employees who are on strike.

Q. WHAT HAPPENS TO CANADIAN NURSES' WORK VISAS DURING A STRIKE?

A. Being on strike does not cancel or suspend work visas. During a ULP strike, Corewell Health cannot fire or permanently replace any nurse for striking.

Q. WHAT IF A NURSE IS STILL ON ORIENTATION OR PROBATION WHEN A STRIKE BEGINS?

A. Nurses in orientation or probation are permitted to strike and picket and are fully protected under federal labor law.
